

Those in Northern Malawi, live in severe scarcity of both resources and opportunities.

As a team, we'll be working in the community of Lhomero, a network of 42 villages. Love a Village works with local partners to achieve Clean Water, Food Security, Safe Shelter, Health and Hygiene, and Education (with a focus on girls). This will be my first time going to Malawi and though I have theoretically learned about the complex relationships of people in their environments, my understanding of such relationships has not gone much further than the borders of a classroom. This past year the concept of faith in ACTION has been placed on my heart particularly the verse Matthew 25:34-40, a part of verse 40 states "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." This verse expresses my motivation to go, learn about love, and show love to others.

I discovered Love a Village through their newsletters which my mom would forward to me. Initially I didn't think much about the emails. However, I thought the mission of LAV was a powerful and inspiring one. It wasn't until this year that I felt inspired to GO to Malawi and take part in LAV's mission which works alongside Malawians by empowering them to break the cycle of poverty. It is hard to know what to expect from this project, but I have faith that God will do something big through our team. I know that there will be many highs and lows and a plethora of emotions along this journey. I am anticipating that in Malawi we will observe and absorb a lot of new things which are much different than our North American culture and comforts such as simple amenities of water or electricity.
